### Major Research Activities and Interests

- 1975–present      Serving (in collaboration with Lloyd Johnston) as Principal Investigator of the Monitoring the Future project, a nationwide cohort-sequential study of eighth, tenth and twelfth grade students, college students and young adults. The project includes large-scale nationwide samples of high school seniors each year beginning in 1975, plus longitudinal follow-ups of subsamples from each senior class. Analyses and publications have focused on levels of drug use and drug-related attitudes, correlates of drug use, longitudinal analysis of changes in drug use, sex-role attitudes and their correlates, impacts of student part-time work intensity, views about military service, self-esteem, other values and attitudes, and various methodological issues.
- 1995–2000      Served as Principal Investigator of a project monitoring the military enlistment plans and behaviors of men and women in the United States. This work analyzed data from the Monitoring the Future project focused specifically on military service plans and actual enlistment.
- 1994–1996      Served as Principal Investigator of a project studying what Michigan citizens and physicians think about aid-in-dying (physician-assisted suicide and voluntary active euthanasia). This interdisciplinary project, involving collaborators from the School of Public Health and the Medical School, carried out a series of mail surveys of the Michigan general public, and Michigan physicians, examining their views about various ways in which physicians should or should not respond to incurable patients' requests to hasten death. Response rates of 74% or higher indicate the high levels of interest in these topics. Results have been reported in the scientific literature and in a special summary of findings provided to Michigan legislators.
- 1972–1976      Served as Director of Survey Research Center's program of periodic Omnibus Interview Studies.
- 1969–1977      Directed studies of attitudes and behaviors related to an all-volunteer military force in the United States.
- 1965–1977      Served as Principal Investigator of the Youth in Transition project, a nationwide longitudinal study examining growth and change in young men during the high school years. Major analyses and publications dealt with effects of family background and ability, causes and effects of dropping out of high school, school effects, self-esteem, views about military service, post-high school environments and experiences.
- 1962–1965      Studied organizational characteristics, influence processes, and the impact of organizations on individuals.
